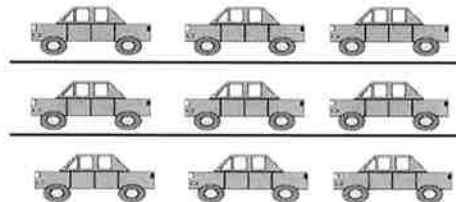

Video games strain Italian internet as coronavirus keeps kids home

Italy is on lockdown. The government is trying to stop the coronavirus from spreading. Italy has been hit very hard by the virus.

The government has limited almost all travel. People are not allowed to gather outside their houses. Schools have shut down.

The coronavirus is also called COVID-19. It is a sickness that is kind of like the flu. The coronavirus is a pandemic. This means it has spread to countries worldwide. Sometimes it can be deadly. The virus mostly targets older people. The risk of children getting it is low.

Now, Italy is seeing side effects from closing schools. They had not expected these problems.

The kids who are home from school are not really allowed to leave the house. It is not hard to guess what many are doing. Many are playing video games.

Italian Internet Traffic Is Way Up

Italian internet companies are having problems because of gaming. Many kids, along with adults, are playing "Fortnite" and "Call of Duty." They are online every day. It causes a lot of internet traffic. The internet slows down. It can even stop working.

Luigi Gubitosi is in charge of Telecom Italia. It is a company that provides internet. Gubitosi said his company has seen a very large increase in internet traffic. It's because of gaming.

The gaming traffic did shut down the internet in Italy. The internet outage was short, though.

The U.S. might face the same problem very shortly. State after state has begun closing schools. Some schools are closed for two weeks. Others are closed for three weeks. It could be longer, depending on how coronavirus continues to spread.

Lots Of People Are Playing Video Games Right Now

American kids will probably do a similar thing as Italian kids. They will be playing online video games. They need to pass the time indoors. Many will have no school or homework. They will have no sports. They will have little else to do but play games and watch TV. We have already seen some U.S. internet companies lift internet limits because of the virus.

"Call of Duty" was not directly mentioned by Telecom Italia. Activision is the company that makes "Call of Duty." This week, it released its Warzone battle royale. The game drew 6 million players on its first day.

It's easy to wonder how the U.S. will handle an internet slowdown. In Italy, internet companies have been able to keep up so far.

Still, the U.S. has far more people. The country can have a whole lot of internet problems even on a good day. As more U.S. schools close, expect more internet gaming traffic. It is unclear how that will affect the internet overall.
